PRIME UNIVERSITY LIBRARY (PUL)

Prime University library, since its inception in 2002, has been providing different sources of information and support for teaching, learning and research activities of faculty members, students and employees of the University. Over the years, the Library has grown and expanded its services and has been using all its efforts to turn it into a resourceful modern library.

The University library is an important part of higher educational institutions and usually serves two complementary purposes: (1) to provide the support service for the course curricula and (2) to support the faculty members and students on research and development activities. A library is regarded as the storehouse of knowledge and the resource centre of all academic activities of a university. Since the very inception of the University, Prime University Library has been serving for the achievement of the goal of the University. Prime university library cares for learning, teaching and research activities through easy access and use of its large number of printed collections, e-books and online resources. It has a floor area of 3174 sq. ft. It is decorated with a modern and suitable student reading room and Wi-Fi connection.

In 2021-22, the Library continued to enrich its collections and services by purchasing and subscribing to print and electronic resources and to develop and maintain the required technical infrastructure for getting access to those resources.

Improving the Collection:

Prime University Library is trying to extend the range of its collections by purchasing printed reading materials as well as subscribing to a good number of e-resources through UGC Digital Library (UDL). The inclusions in 2021-2022 are:

- 610 copies of books added to the main collection;
- 150 journals, reports magazines, etc. obtained from other sources which are not subscribed by the library;
- Continued subscription to more than 3500 e-books;
- 1520 e-books and e-journals downloaded free from unsubscribed websites.

Resources:

The existing Library is a growing part of Prime University. The collection of books and resources in the library is increasing day by day. At present, the library has a collection of about 32527 books, 620 reports, and 1113 journals. The resources of the library fulfil the requirement of the programs offered by the university and also meet the general interests of the users. All collections are classified, catalogued and displayed using international standards. The library preserves books, magazines, dissertations, newspapers, journals, audio-visual materials etc, covering academic programs like English, Business Studies, Law, Education, Electrical & Electronic Engineering (EEE), Computer Science and Engineering (CSE), Civil Engineering and Bangla.

E-Resources:

Prime University is a member of the UDL (UGC Digital Library). Users can search, read and download e-resources from the subscribed websites.

Facilities and Services:

- The students are allowed to borrow three books and keep them in their possession for fifteen days.
- Faculty members, executives and staff can borrow books according to their demand for a whole semester.
- An individual can borrow reference books for two hours.
- Students can borrow dissertations for two hours.
- Students can borrow CD/DVD for a week.

- UDL E-resources are available for searching, reading and downloading.
- The reading room is well decorated and air-conditioned.
- National and international magazines and journals are available in the library.

Library Software:

KOHA Library Management Software already installed in the Library. Primarily the data entry activities and Training Program is going on.

Library Hours:

The library remains open from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm from Sunday to Wednesday, 9:00 am to 7:00 pm on Thursday, 8:00 am to 7:00 pm on Friday and 10:30 am to 6:30 pm on Saturday, except the holidays declared by the University authority.

The Amount Spent for the Library:

In the financial year 2021-2022, a sum of BDT 5,30,000 (Taka Five lac thirty thousand only) was spent for the Library facilities from the University fund for purchasing books and development of the library.

Highlights of 2021-2022

Formation of New IQAC Body

Jahidul Azad, Assistant Professor, Department of English was re-appointed as the Additional Director (QA), and Md. The day-long conference of talks, presentations, and panel discussions focused on raising awareness and developing an understanding of the value of focusing on quality enhancement through the professional development of teachers in higher education and curriculum reform.

Workshop on "Outcome Based Education (OBE) Curriculum"

A three-day-long training workshop on 'Outcome Based Education (OBE) Curriculum' was organized by the Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Prime University held from May 14-15, 2022, and on June 5, 2022, in the Conference Room of the University. The members of both side discussed relevant issues of cooperation. As per the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between Prime University and Integral University many programs are supposed to be offered. But due to COVID-19 pandemic those initiatives could not be implemented. However, both universities agreed to strengthen the existing relationship by extending their mutual cooperation.

DIFFERENT ASSOCIATIONS, CLUBS AND SOCIETIES OF PRIME UNIVERSITY

Prime University has not confined its activities only in academic programs, but has also extended its scope to sprout the latent talent in the students to their full potential through the cultivation of different pursuits. With this end in view the University has got a number of clubs and societies in place as mentioned below:

- 1. Prime University Cultural Club: The Prime University Cultural Club organizes cultural programs on special events, arranges yearly cultural competition, hunts for talents on cultural activities among students, faculties & other employees and organizes seasonal functions like Pitha Utshab, Basanto Utshab, Nabanno Utshab etc.
- **2. Prime University Debating Society:** The responsibilities of the Prime University Debating Society are to organize inter and intra university debate and public speaking competitions. It works for hunting and grooming of debaters, organizes workshops and seminars on debate, ensures participation in the inter university, national and other debate competitions, maintains liaison with the debating clubs of different institutions.
- **3. Prime University Drama Club:** The Prime University Drama Club arranges yearly drama mostly in the middle of the month of January. It presents one-act play or short dramas in the cultural programs during observance of national and other important days and also in the cultural programs during Freshers' Receptions and other programs in collaboration with Prime University Cultural Committee.
- **4. Prime University Quiz and Essay Competition Committee:** The Prime University Quiz and Essay Competition Committee is responsible for arrangement of inter-departmental quiz and essay competitions. It is dedicated to creating awareness among the students about the necessity of participating in quiz and essay competitions for the job market.
- **5. Prime University Language Club:** The Prime University Language Club is responsible for taking necessary steps to strengthen the processes of teaching and learning of different languages through the integration of Communication and Information Technology. It arranges cultural, academic and recreational activities in order to acquire skills in different languages. It also collaborates with other institutions/organizations. It integrates students' talents, needs and interests with the language teaching process.

- **6. Prime University Outdoor Games Club:** The Prime University Outdoor Games Club organizes different inter-departmental outdoor games and sports events. It arranges coaching sessions for the players on the eve of each tournament and prepare the schedule of different outdoor events/competitions. It selects the players to form the team for each tournament. The Committee arranges or procures the sports items for participating and organizing of each competition and also prepares the by-laws /rules & regulations for holding different outdoor games and tournaments subject to the approval of the university authority.
- 7. Prime University Indoor Games Club: The responsibilities of the Prime University Indoor Games Club are to organize different inter-departmental indoor games and sports events and arrange coaching sessions for the players throughout the year. It selects the players to form the team for each game to participate in different tournaments, prepare the schedules of different indoor events/competitions. The committee arranges or procures the sports items for participating and organizing of indoor competitions and also prepares the by-laws /rules & regulations of different indoor games and tournaments acting under the supervision of the university authority.
- **8. Prime University Photographic Society:** The main responsibilities of the Prime University Photographic Society are to work for promoting the art, science and fun of photography to the students of the University, to arrange photographic workshop and provide photographic instructions and mentoring. It also arranges photographic competitions within the University.
- **9. Prime University Health Club:** The responsibilities of the Prime University Health Club are to arrange different health related programs like medical camp, eye camp, dental camp, diabetes camp, etc. every year. It also arranges vaccination program, health checkup and different awareness programs from time to time.
- **10. Prime University Career Development Center:** The Prime University Career Development Center is dedicated to helping the students of the University to develop them for achieving the highest career goal and identify the opportunities that are most suitable for them. It arranges seminars, workshops, motivational programs for the students and also arranges career fest for job placement.
- 11. Prime University IELTS Course Conduct Committee: The Prime University IELTS Course Conduct Committee is responsible for enrolment of students in the IELTS course as well as its smooth completion. The committee collects, prepares necessary course materials. It also offers different short

courses to improve English language skill. At the same time it creates awareness about IELTS among students.

- 12. Prime University Freelancing & Outsourcing Course Conduct Committee: Co-ordination of Freelancing and Outsourcing program, marketing, advertising, collection of fees and execution of the program are the main responsibilities of the Prime University Freelancing & Outsourcing Course Conduct Committee.
- 13. Prime University Volunteer Services Club: The Prime University Volunteer Services Club undertakes the responsibilities to arrange events and activities to increase awareness about social issues among the students. It helps to provide necessary campus security management as and when required. It fosters volunteerism among the students, and arranges training activities of the volunteers. It arranges cleanliness campaign in the campus and outside. The Club participates in relief work for any natural and manmade disasters including Fire Fighting and Disaster Management activities along with any other activities directed by the University authority. The Club also helps to arrange recreational activities like picnic for students, faculties, executives and staff of the Prime University Volunteer Services Club.
- 14. Prime University BNCC & Rover Scout Club: The responsibilities of the Prime University BNCC & Rover Scout Club are to form one BNCC (Gents) and one BNCC (Ladies) platoon with the students of Prime University. It is dedicated to arrange proper training to the BNCC and Rover Scout members and involve them in social services. It will also make the BNCC and Rover Scout to involve in inter university activities.
- **15. Prime University Blood Donation Club:** The Prime University Blood Donation Club is committed to arranging blood donation campaign periodically. It also keeps liaison with blood donors round the year.
- **16. Prime University Tourism Club:** Arranging study tours within and outside the country for the students is the main responsibility of the Prime University Tourism Club.
- 17. Prime University Computer Networking Club: The responsibilities of the Prime University Computer Networking Club are to arrange short courses, seminars, workshops for students. It works for the improvement of the Networking skills of the students of the department of CSE.

- **18. Prime University Electrical and Electronic Club:** The Prime University Electrical and Electronic Club is committed to arranging seminars, workshops and project fairs to keep the students updated with the competitive world. It provides different types of practical trainings to increase practical knowledge and experience of the students.
- **19. Prime University Computer Programming Club:** The responsibilites of the Prime University Computer Programming Club are to arrange seminars, workshops, CSE carnival, programming contests for the students. It also works for the improvement of the programming skills of the students.
- **20. Prime University Students' Welfare Club:** The Prime University Students' Welfare Club is responsible for the general and specific well-being of the students of the University. It works for the overall welfare of the students in terms of student development through involving them with the other 19 clubs of the University. The Club also motivates students to participate in various activities, competitions at university, national and international levels.

EXTRA FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS, ACADEMIC AND NON-ACADEMIC STAFFS

Prime University Alumni Association (PUAA)

Prime University Alumni Association (PUAA) is an association of graduates and post graduates who completed their graduation & post-graduation degrees from Prime University. The office of the Prime University Alumni Association is situated at 114/116, Mazar Road, Mirpur-1, Dhaka-1216. Prime University Alumni Association (PUAA) tries to play an important role in helping to shape the future of the University by representing the views of its members, and contributing to building an engaged and supportive alumni community appropriate to a world-class university.

In close collaboration with the authorities of the University, this association organizes a wide range of events like social knowledge sharing, re-union, picnics, iftar mahfil etc. It is also committed to supporting the alumni in their careers and links closely with the University's careers service to support mentoring and intern opportunities. The current President of Prime University Alumni Association (PUAA) is Prof. Dr. M. Jahangir Alam, Vice-Chancellor of the University (ex-officio).

Prime University Employees' Welfare Fund

The Prime University has instituted a welfare fund in the name and style of 'Prime University Employees' Welfare Fund' in order to enlist the whole hearted dedication of all classes of employees of the University to attain its object of rendering prime knowledge among its students even in the face of grave emergencies. The fund consists of the contribution of the employees the amount of which varies depending on the scales of pay of the employees as a well as grant from the University General Fund. The accumulated amount of collection from employees and contribution from the University fund is invested in a bank account in the name of 'Prime University Employees' Welfare Fund'. In case of the dire necessity of the employees, such as serious illness or injuries requiring hospitalization and prolonged treatment, extreme financial distress, death of the employee while in service, etc, grants are made from the Welfare Fund. There is also a provision for sanction of money from the fund on the retirement of employees after serving for at least 12 years continuously.

Medical Service in Prime University

Prime University Medical Center has been functioning in the campus. Dr. M. Saiful Islam, MBBS, MS (Ortho) has been appointed as the University Medical Officer. Necessary facilities have been in place to provide primary care to the students, faculties, officers and staff on regular basis.

Prayer Room for Male and Female Personnel

Separate Prayer Rooms have already been arranged for male and female personnel in the Campus. The male prayer room in the basement is well arranged and a large number of people can pray at a time.

There is also an arrangement for prayer room for female students, faculties and staff. Situated at level 01, it has provision for a large number of female devotees to say prayers in a congenial atmosphere.

Car Parking Zone

At the basement of the University building there is a large car parking zone which is 5,600 square feet in area. The car parking zone is meant for all the members of Prime University family including students and guests for safe parking of their cars.
